



Acceptability of Making an Uncured, Uncooked, Unsmoked Multi-Ingredient Product for HRI

Question:

Is it acceptable for a retail exempt establishment to make an uncured, uncooked, unsmoked (multi-ingredient) meat product and sell it to HRI within the limits of the retail exemption regulations?

Answer:

Yes, a retail store may cut up, trim, slice, grind, freeze, products made from meat even if the products are multi-ingredient and sell such products to other than household consumers within the limits set out in 9 CFR 303.1 (d)(2)(ii) and(iii). A retail store may not sell to non-household consumers product that it has cooked, cured, smoked, rendered, refined, or otherwise processed in a manner not listed in 9 CFR 303.1(d)(2)(i)(a),(b),(d), or (e) without being under inspection.
